# South Asia Chapter Members Receive the IIL Purdue Research Grants

Members of the South Asia Chapter from Bangladesh, India, Maldives, and Pakistan have received Purdue's Institute of Information Literacy (IIL) research grants of \$4,000. This grants aims to develop or enhance information literacy models or techniques that support individuals, communities, or organizations in using information wisely. The current project will explore the perceived usefulness and readiness of artificial intelligence (AI) in health information literacy (HIL) among women in South Asia.

A group of five project members, led by Md. Anwarul Islam from the University of Dhaka, Bangladesh, includes Bhakti Gala, Central University of Gujarat, India; Aminath Riyaz, The Maldives National University, Maldives; Raj Kumar Bhardwaj, St. Stephen's College, University of Delhi, India; and Tabassum Aslam, Lahore School of Economics, Punjab, Pakistan. This two-year project, starting in September 2024, will investigate the intersection of HIL and AI in improving health outcomes for women in South Asia.

By understanding how women in South Asia perceive the usefulness of AI in enhancing HIL and the factors influencing their readiness to adopt AI-driven health information technologies, the project aims to yield valuable insights. Using a qualitative research method, the study will conduct focus group discussions with at least 30 women from each participating South Asian country. We believe that the project's outcomes can assist policymakers and governments in creating HIL policies tailored specifically for women in this region. We will reach you to get your support and valuable opinions on this project. We will be posting the updates of this project in the SA newsletter and other platforms.

# Conference on Public Community Libraries in NEPAL

Though the history of the establishment of Public/Community Libraries (P/CLs) in Nepal is around 100 years old, still the condition of theses libraries is not good. Very few attentions have been given to enhance the capacity of these libraries. Keeping in mind, Government of Nepal, Ministry of Education, Science and Technology (MoEST) along with the partner institutions motivated to organize state-level conferences on P/CLs.

Six conferences were held in the different states. Each state participating P/CLs shared their histories, services they are providing, current situation and future challenges. It was a good opportunity to advocate the need and importance of P/CLs. Participating libraries of each state conference, made their commitment of make a common platform. The unanimously declared the conferences manifestos shed light the duties and responsibilities can be provided by the P/CLs and the duties and responsibilities to the P/CLs by the State, Providences, Local levels and stakeholders. It was an opportunity to bring to sit in one place, share their ideas, feelings and opportunities and create a common network to advocate the use and importance of P/CLS.



#### **Awards Distribution**

Veteran Politician and Historian Dr. Dilliraman Regmai donated all his property along with around 35000 books, artifacts to the Government of Nepal (GoN) to establish library in his name in 1980s. After his demise in 2002, GoN established Dr. Dilliraman Kalyani Regmi Memorial Library Development Board in 2004 and open for the public.

This year in 2024, the library formed an independent committee to search the right candidate to select one candidate for Dr. Dilliraman National and International awards. The veteran journalist Mr. Bhairab Risal and Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA). These prestigious awards will be distributed by the Rt. Honorable president of Nepal organizing a handover ceremony. Likewise, the library announced nation level essay competition on the topic "Library form generation to generations." The prize handover ceremony was organized on 14<sup>th</sup> July 2024 it the Library.



### Seminar on "Reading Habits for College Students"

A, "Reading Habits for College Students" was jointly organized by ASIS&T South Asia, ASIS&T SIGED and Peoples Campus dated 28th June 2024. # Md. Anwarul Islam - Bangladesh

Md. Anwarul Islam was born and brought up in the northern part of Bangladesh. He graduated in Information Science and Library Management (ISLM) from the University of Dhaka (DU). In 2012, he participated in a visiting scholar program at the University of Antwerp, Belgium, under the VLIR-UOS scholarship. In 2013, he pursued a PhD in Knowledge Management at the Japan Advanced Institute of Science and Technology (JAIST) in the School of Knowledge Science. During his PhD, he was also at Nanyang Technological University under the ACRC Fellowship in the Wee Kim Wee School of Communication and Information.

After completing his PhD, he undertook a postdoctoral fellowship at the University of British Columbia, Canada in the School of Library, Archival and Information Studies (SLAIS), now known as *i* School.

His research interests include information behavior, knowledge management, informetrics, and social informatics. He is currently co-authoring a book on knowledge management in libraries, to be published by Taylor and Francis. He has

traveled to several countries, including Japan, Malaysia, the UK, Belgium, the Netherlands, France, Singapore, the USA,

Canada, and Australia to present papers and serve as an invited speaker. He has published widely in the leading information science journals, serves as a reviewer for numerous flagship journals, editor for conference proceedings, and is currently an international editor for *Data, Information and Management* (Elsevier).

He has been actively engaged in national and international professional associations and received several awards, including the New Leaders Award, the James M. Crestos Leadership Award, and the Lois Lunin Award from The Association for Information Science and Technology (ASIS&T). Currently, he is leading an international research project on AI and health information literacy in the context of

women in South Asia, funded by the IIL Research Grants of Purdue University, USA.

Reflecting on the person he was sixteen years ago compared to now, he noticed a complete transformation. Today, he is a LIS researcher and academic, and a proud father of three lovely and naughty boys (Arham, Afsan and Aymaan), two of them are school-aged. His wife is a civil servant in Bangladesh, and they live together in Dhaka. He is fond of traveling, loves coffee, and enjoys watching

movies whenever he has the time. He always chooses to believe in people, regardless of how often they may break their promises. His greatest joy comes from helping others find happiness. 




